

### Fund Objective

The portfolio aims to provide investors with a higher level of income than a pure income fund, while minimising risk and ensuring capital stability. The investment manager will actively manage the investment opportunities to achieve the best rates of income from income generating instruments within the investment universe, to achieve the funds objective.

### Fund Universe

To achieve this objective, the securities normally to be included in the portfolio will comprise a combination of global bonds, interest bearing securities, including loan stock, preference shares, equity securities, listed property securities, semi-gilts, debentures, debenture bonds and notes, money market instruments, and other non-equity securities, in line with the objective of the portfolio and assets in liquid form. Interest bearing instruments in a currency other than the Republic of South Africa, may only be included in this portfolio, if they comply with a credit rating of investment grade by the credit rating agencies approved by the Registrar, or if they comply with other regulations published by the Registrar, provided further that if the grading of an instrument differs between the rating agencies, the lower grading will apply.

### Manager Commentary

Markets are discounting a robust recovery as almost US\$3trn of stimulus have been injected in 2021 to combat low growth and unemployment in the US alone, with further infrastructure spending on the cards. In the Fed's March meeting statement, a dovish bias was maintained and cautioned that the outlook is still very uncertain and that it is far from attaining its goals of full employment and 2% average inflation and pledged to keep interest low until at least 2023.

Bond markets are discounting rising inflation and real yield were rising with the US 10-year bond yields closing higher to close at 1.75% at month end. Locally our bond market followed suit and recorded a negative total return of 2.49% m/m while the CILl inflation-linked bond index returned 0.64% m/m and cash returned 0.33% m/m.

The South African Reserve Bank (SARB) monetary policy committee also kept rates on hold as inflation remains contained, although the growth forecast was revised higher. 4Q20 GDP rose by 6.3% q/q against the Bloomberg consensus estimate of 5.6%. 3Q20 GDP was revised upward to 67.3% from 66.1% previously. Despite the strong 2H20 recovery, GDP is still down 7.0% y/y – taking it to 2013 levels in constant rand terms.

Local equities moved in lockstep with international peers and gained 1.58% m/m in total return and listed property stayed in positive territory, returning 1.23% m/m. In March we saw the second blow-up on Wall Street hedge funds. The unwinding of Archegos Capital Management after banks forced it to dump investments accumulated through highly leveraged bets followed on the footsteps of the GameStop short- squeeze saga.

Non-residents remained net sellers of South African bonds and equities in March. The rand traded as low as R15.54/\$, but closed stronger (2.3% stronger m/m) at month-end at R14.78/\$. The rand also gained against the euro (5% m/m) and the pound (3.2% m/m).

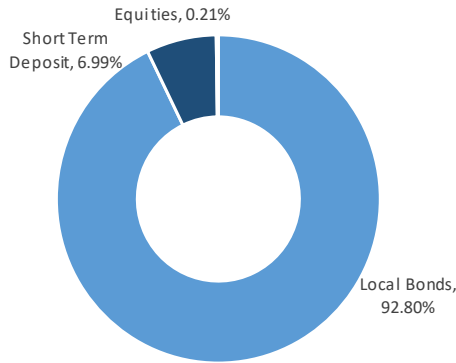

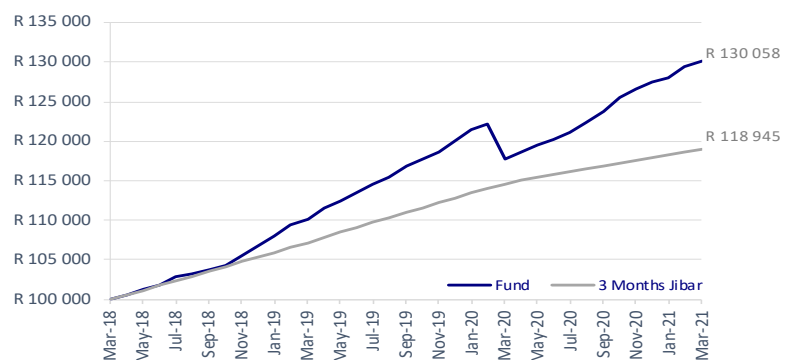

Volatility is a statistical measure of the dispersion of returns for a given security or market index.

Tracking error is a measure of the risk in an investment portfolio that is due to active management decisions made by the portfolio manager; it indicates how closely a portfolio follows the index to which it is benchmarked.

Information ratio, is a measure of the risk-adjusted return of a portfolio. In this case, it measures the active return of the manager's portfolio divided by the amount of risk that the manager takes relative to the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio is a measure for calculating risk-adjusted return. It is the average return earned in excess of the risk-free rate per unit of total risk. The greater a portfolio's Sharpe ratio, the better its risk-adjusted performance has been (i.e. a higher return with a contained risk profile, where the portfolio manager is not taking excessive risk to achieve those returns).

Beta is a measure of the volatility, or systematic risk, of a security or a portfolio in comparison to the market as a whole.

Alpha is a measure of the active return on an investment. It represents the excess returns of a fund relative to the return of a suitable benchmark.
