

Fund Objective

The Triathlon IP Fund is a moderate to high risk, flexible fund. The objective of this portfolio is to achieve capital appreciation over the medium to long term. There will be no limitations on the relative exposure of the portfolio to any asset class. The fund is suitable for use by investors with a long term investment horizon who are comfortable with shorter term volatility as well as the risk associated with a fund mandated to achieve real long term growth. Through its flexible mandate, investors are looking to the manager to make tactical asset allocation decisions in the achievement of the mandate.

Fund Universe

The fund will typically be invested in an equity portfolio of high conviction positions. The manager has full flexibility to vary this position through tactical asset allocation to other asset classes.

Manager Commentary

Equity:

The magnitude of economic events surrounding the second quarter of 2020 followed on from a first quarter in which markets were sent reeling due to the impact of COVID-19. The second quarter will be remembered for a spectacular rebound. The final impact of COVID-19 on the economy, jobs, healthcare costs etc. is still unknown, but that has not prevented markets delivering spectacular performance returns.

The rebound was largely driven by governments and central banks providing significant monetary and fiscal stimulus on a scale never seen before. The result was that trillions of dollars were injected into markets in order to avert a global economic meltdown.

Global equity markets rose over 20% over the quarter with the US leading the way with its best quarterly gain since 1998 of 26%. Similar returns have been mirrored elsewhere in developed markets. Emerging markets also had a stellar quarter albeit from a low base with a rise of just over 18%.

The JSE experienced a similar rebound with the JSE All Share gaining just over 22%. Even the beleaguered financial index managed a gain of over 9%. The listed property sector managed a 17.5% rise after its sharp decline in Q1.

Fixed Income:

Government bonds have enjoyed another good quarter, as the real yields offered are still attractive to more cautious investors and those still wary of relatively high-priced equities.

The South African bond index rose 13.5%.

There were two additional rate cuts by the South Africa Reserve Bank with the Repo rate ending at 3.75% down from 5.25% at the start of the quarter. It is hoped that this rate reduction will ease the interest burden on consumers and assist in stabilising the economy as the lockdown restrictions are eased. Many businesses are likely to experience difficult trading conditions as personal spending patterns have changed dramatically.

The South African GDP shrank by an annualised rate of -2% in the first quarter (better than the forecast of a 3.8% decline). Realistically the economy was not in good shape prior to the Covid-19 lockdown. Forecasts for GDP in 2020 are for a negative growth of -8%.

More alarming was Tito Mboweni's Supplementary Budget Review which forecast concerning numbers of a projected 81.8% debt to GDP ratio for this year growing to 87.4% by 2023/24. This might lead to a further ratings downgrade and hence a higher rate of interest which South Africa will have to pay on an ever-increasing debt burden. Not good news for consumers and taxpayers.

The Rand took a sharp fall during the quarter to trade as low as R19/\$ but fared reasonably well by quarter end strengthening by 2.8% to R17.35/\$.

Performance:

The FTSE/JSE Capped Swix40 index performance declined -25.82% in Q1 and rebounded 23.18% in Q2, resulting in a movement for this year of -8.62%. The fund's NAV to NAV performance was up 3.46% for Q2 but down in line with general markets for the year with a decline of -8.64%.

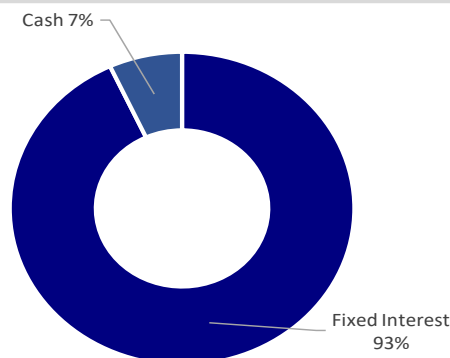

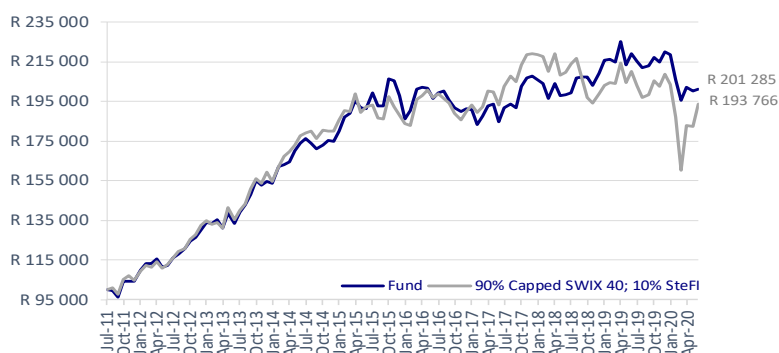

Volatility is a statistical measure of the dispersion of returns for a given security or market index.

Tracking error is a measure of the risk in an investment portfolio that is due to active management decisions made by the portfolio manager; it indicates how closely a portfolio follows the index to which it is benchmarked.

Information ratio, is a measure of the risk-adjusted return of a portfolio. In this case, it measures the active return of the manager's portfolio divided by the amount of risk that the manager takes relative to the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio is a measure for calculating risk-adjusted return. It is the average return earned in excess of the risk-free rate per unit of total risk. The greater a portfolio's Sharpe ratio, the better its risk-adjusted performance has been (i.e. a higher return with a contained risk profile, where the portfolio manager is not taking excessive risk to achieve those returns).

Beta is a measure of the volatility, or systematic risk, of a security or a portfolio in comparison to the market as a whole.

Alpha is a measure of the active return on an investment. It represents the excess returns of a fund relative to the return of a suitable benchmark.
